

ARTISTIC FREEDOM ? UNESCO DEFINITION



- > the right to create without censorship or intimidation
- > the right to have artistic work supported, distributed remunerated
- > the right to freedom of movement
- > the right to freedom of association
- > the right to protection of economic and social rights
- > the right to participate in cultural life

- Direct access without traditional intermediaries (gate keepers)

Challenges


- > Protection (trolling, harassment)

 - > Digital divide/ e-literacy, contents diversity


Access: equality / restrictions

Protection: physical safety / income






